Responsible Gambling Trust announces change to independent trustees

The Responsible Gambling Trust has announced that Professor Chris Brady is to join the charity as an Independent Trustee. Professor Brady's appointment follows the decision of Liz Barclay to stand down as Senior Independent Trustee.

Chris Brady is Professor of Management Studies at Salford Business School, University of Salford. His expertise in football business and finance will add to the Responsible Gambling Trust's knowledge-base in the important area of gambling in sport at a time when the relationship between gambling and sport, particularly through advertising, is garnering greater public interest. He will sit on the full Board of Trustees in addition to joining the Responsible Gambling Trust's Research Committee.

Liz Barclay has shown great dedication to the Responsible Gambling Trust since she joined the Board of Trustees in 2012. Liz's wide experience across journalism, the charitable sector and consumer affairs has greatly benefited the Responsible Gambling Trust. She has decided to reduce her public and charitable commitments and to make way for new expertise on the Board of Trustees. We would like to thank Liz for the enormous contribution she has made to the good governance of the Responsible Gambling Trust, to the understanding of gambling related harm and to the development of treatment and harm prevention services for problem gamblers.

Professor Jo Wolff, who chairs the Responsible Gambling Trust's Research Committee, has agreed to assume the role of Senior Independent Trustee.
